On January 29, 2025, President Trump signed an executive order mandating that federal agencies identify and find ways to address anti-Semitism, focusing on educational institutions and using Title VI of the Civil Rights Act. Arnold & Porter has a long history of fighting against discrimination — and especially anti-Semitism — under Title VI. Our work has included representation of nonprofit organizations, student organizations, and individuals in bringing Title VI cases against colleges and universities. We also represent higher education institutions seeking assistance reviewing their policies, practices, and procedures to ensure compliance mandated by executive actions and offer broad student protections. We have also represented American Jews who were victims of terrorist attacks in Israel.
